
Warm Christian greetings to all in the SEAN world-wide family and welcome to our latest edition of SPREAD.



A Last Letter from Chile

23rd July 2008

Dear friends,

Our love and greetings to you all. We are coming up to quite a large change in our lives. Due to several circumstances relating to family and particularly to my parents, the South American Mission Society has kindly allowed us to



bring forward our regular home-leave by six months so that we can look after them and begin our process of retirement.

Of course "retirement" is very far from our minds! But it does mean that age advances and in less than 18 months, I (Terry) will be an old age pensioner!! I thank the Lord that my young wife will keep me on my toes for a few more vears!!!

We praise the Lord for our life in South America (in my case 56 years!) and we leave with mixed feelings, but a light heart. By the grace of God, the churches we left 18 months ago are flourishing, so leaving them was the right step. And, the new Pehuenche teaching ministry is also expanding, and will be continued by a team led by two full-time workers. We'll continue to work with them from a distance by designing visuals and courses for them to use locally.

Last week we were there and the five leading students took their exams - all five passed, and one with full marks. The new Cauñicu Chapel is also nearing roofing stage and will be a great blessing to the whole area. So, do please pray for this development.

Extracts from Terry and Pancha's October 2008 letter

We had a very productive SEAN Trustee meeting in early October in which we set out the plans for the next few years. One really positive development has been the incorporation of new Trustees, all of whom are very experienced in the SEAN TEE ministry in strategic areas abroad and each can travel to the countries where our courses are used.

But there is still plenty of travel left for us!! At the end of October we go to the Far East for a SEAN graduation. In that particular area the programme is spreading and students number in the thousands.

Later this year I leave for a three week trip to Colombia where the SEAN programme is widely used. The denomination that uses SEAN in northern Colombia has grown from 250 to 750 congregations in the last 25 years. Many of these new churches are led by SEAN students and it is my joy to be able to visit some of them. Then in the Capital, Bogotá, another major TEE programme (AFLET) that uses SEAN is having its 20th year anniversary celebrations.

Finally in Chile, it will be a great blessing to return to visit our Pehuenche churches, share in the weekend study, take the final exam of the Life of Christ Book 2 and attend the inauguration of the new Chapel and study centre in Cauñicú.

Thank you so much for your continued support and prayers. It is such a blessing to know that we have your fellowship in the Lord.

In December, NICK WOODBURY - 'LATIN AMERICAN MISSION' wrote to SEAN International as follows:-

What a privilege it was to travel in Colombia with Terry Barratt the week of November 18-25. It not only brought back memories of our first meeting in 1981 in Coastal Colombia, but also gave reason for much rejoicing in the Lord.

I was a missionary serving with the Latin American Mission in Colombia in 1981. We were struggling to find a way to train the national pastors since the national Bible Institute had closed in 1980. When Terry visited us, he introduced us to the SEAN courses as a basis for all pastors and leaders.

In 1982, the Colombian Pastoral Institute (CIPEP) was formally launched with 40 students, mostly pastors from the Caribbean Association of Evangelical Churches (AIEC). Over these 25 years, CIPEP has helped leaders from 40 different denominations to receive training through the SEAN Courses. The AIEC has grown from 250 churches to 750. A requirement of the pastoral level is that each student must plant a new church. We visited a few of these churches in November 2008. Some have grown to several hundred believers.

Along with the Colombian Pastoral Institute, we praise the Lord for SEAN, a ministry led by the Holy Spirit to provide materials to help train pastors and leaders all over Latin America and around the world. To God be the Glory!

In His Service

Empowering Christ's followers...to live and work for Him



Tim Green (pictured) is deeply involved in Theological Education by Extension (TEE). With his family he lived and worked in Pakistan for many years. He has also served in Jordan. He and his family now live in Oxford UK

Tim has used SEAN Courses extensively in his ministry. He has also written courses, two of which are now part of the SEAN Curriculum of Courses. He has been a Trustee of SEAN International since 2003.

Here he writes of recent experiences and presents some challenges....

Central Asia

"Picture the scene: a basement workshop in a Central Asian city, in April this year.

Printing machinery, piles of paper in assorted sizes, and racks of books fill almost all the available space, leaving just enough room for us to squeeze in for a cup of tea with the friendly Christian printer and his wife. We have come to ask his advice on getting a course book printed locally.

We show him the Russian original. "Hang on a minute!", he replies, "Haven't I printed that book before?" We can't see how, since it has just come in from Russia. But he opens up his computer file. There on his screen I recognise the text and diagrams of a course I had written in a different country for a different readership in a different language fifteen years ago - someone must have already pirated it! That was a bizarre moment.

When I wrote a little course *Abundant Light* to help Pakistani Christians read the Bible for themselves, I had no idea it would spread any wider. But a group called SEAN ('Study by Extension for All Nations') asked to produce the course in English for a wider audience. I happily agreed and gave them the right to translate it into English and publish it as a SEAN Course as I have such a respect for the humble way they serve churches worldwide.

Southern Chile

Actually SEAN's work of ministry training began more than thirty years ago, among the indigenous Christians of southern Chile. These local Indian farmers were mature, intelligent and keen, capable of Christian ministry. But their lack of secondary education barred them from entry to formal theological colleges. Also, in their poverty, they couldn't leave their small-holdings and families to go away to an alien environ-

So SEAN brought the training to them, through a 'blended' approach which developed study skills, ministry skills and Christian character, right where they lived.

This proved so successful that now SEAN's courses have spread to over 100 countries. Stories come in from around the world of ordinary working adults being empowered to live and work for Jesus in their churches and workplaces and slums and prisons.

Looking to the Future

SEAN and similar curriculum providers do not run their own training across the world, rather they allow local groups to use courses as needed in their own context. Accountability to the <u>local</u> churches is a strength of this worldwide TEE movement.

One challenge (and opportunity) is for the TEE movement to update itself with the best of the new educational theory and information technology developed in recent years, without losing the essence of what has made it so fruitful at a grass-roots level.

A second opportunity (and thereby a challenge) is to adapt to the changing pattern of world population. In the past, peoples of one ethnic group mostly lived in one country. Now they are spread right around the globe, scattered by war or more commonly by their search for work. So how do you provide for the Christian training needs of Nepalis in Malaysia, Koreans in Siberia, or Pakistanis in the Gulf?



TEE can do so, through the sharing of courses and expertise across national boundaries. It's an exciting but complex task. For instance, my Central Asia visit in April was to try to help six groups from four countries to work together in harmony and with shared purpose.

A third challenge (more of a threat) is of finance. National TEE groups are chronically under-funded. Somehow it seems easier to raise Christian money for bricks and mortar than for equipping a volunteer army for Jesus!

News in Brief/Prayer Please:-

 We report with great sadness the death of the leader of SEAN Spain - Pastor Dr. Pablo Rois. He was taken ill with Pancreatic Cancer and died six months ago.

Our thoughts and prayers are with his family at this time.

Pablo's death is a major blow to the SEAN programme in Spain as he was its prime mover. We need to try to remedy the situation.

- Matheteuo, a sister organisation, has just em barked on a major preparation of Anglicans in Uganda to begin a new, nationwide, TEE pro gramme in English, based on SEAN.
 We will give more details of this exciting and farreaching project as they emerge.
- By email we received this very encouraging news from Korea.

"There are a few good size (500-700 adult atten dants on Sunday) churches who adopted TEE/ SEAN courses as their main bible education sys tem.

Since they did that about 1-2 years passed, and now they not only see that the members change, they also find that numbers of attendants start growing though they did not put any significant effort for it.

They are seeing the church grow naturally (in quantity) by the strengthening of the members (quality)."

With Terry and Pancha's return to the UK, the Chile office will gradually wind down. The process of opening up a new office in the UK and transferring files etc here will be an enormous task.

Gloria Dean our International Co-ordinator will be in Chile in early 2009 to facilitate this process.
