An amazing occasion in Malaysia

"Millions flock to Malaysia from different Asian countries, in search of work or refuge or education. They include many Nepali Christians. They are first generation believers of Hindu background. How can the churches here help them grow strong in Christ and active in witness, despite not speaking their language?

One answer is through the TEE discipleship groups which have mushroomed here in the last three years. Just imagine: 60 such groups, meeting every week to do biblical courses in their heart language, with 386 students! In June some of them came together for the first ever Nepali TEE conference in Malaysia. What a joy it was to join them!



- One participant, having worked throughout the night at the factory shift, came straight on the conference the next morning. Despite regularly working 12 hour shifts he still finds time for his TEE homework and even leads two TEE weekly groups as well.
- Another participant has been a believer for four years but previously didn't understand the Bible. He said the TEE courses have given him a way both to understand God's Word and to pass it on to others. When his contract finishes in Malaysia he will return to Nepal where he plans to start a discipleship group in his own village.
- A third person had only ever completed five months of formal education in Nepal. But the first TEE discipleship course helped him to read and write, and this gave him the confidence to persevere with the more difficult later courses. Now he is leading a group himself.

TEE groups are now spreading in three other diaspora languages apart from Nepali, and also in English and Chinese for national Christians. Partnership is growing, as more Malaysian churches give support and help to the diaspora TEE work. This model is gaining traction in Malaysia and could work just as well in other countries, wherever national churches have a vision to disciple the nations in their midst, such as Bangkok, Sydney, Dubai... 
'Pure Gold' at the 'Church on the Beach'

SEAN's Regional Coordinator for Africa, Revd Tony Thompson, writes......

In our retirement, my wife and I live in the English South-Coast town of Shoreham by Sea. We worship at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Shoreham Beach which, because of its nearness to the beach, is often spoken of as the 'Church on the Beach'.

During 2017, one of my Africa-related projects involved working towards the production of the first Portuguese translation of the SEAN 'Big Picture' course – a course that provides an overview of the whole Bible. One of our partners in Mozambique wished to use this course in their Theological Education by Extension programme.

That same year, was celebrated by our Anglican Diocese of Chichester, as the 'Year of the Bible'. So, committed as I was at that time, to the 'Big Picture' for Mozambique, I decided it would be only right to offer to 'Church on the Beach' members the opportunity to study the UK English version of this course - 'Pure Gold'.





Here's what three of them wrote about their experience:

"I enjoyed the Group meetings for our 'Pure Gold' study. Most of the bible study I had done previously was on a particular book or part of the Bible - mainly New Testament. So, it was very useful to gain joined up knowledge of the **whole** Bible and learn of the evidence for its reliability and truthfulness. I also thought that the questions to ask ourselves about a particular Bible verse like "What promise, command, example or warning does this verse contain?" very helpful." "I found the "Pure Gold" course very enlightening. The group meetings were very interesting and friendly hearing the thoughts and views of others. The time seemed to fly by. I learned so much about the Bible which I never knew before." (Robert Caffyn – right foreground in photo)

Realising that my knowledge of the Bible was represented by a series of extracts and quotations, I have been seeking an overview to bring these elements together. I, therefore, welcomed the invitation to join the 'Pure Gold' group. The structure of the course, excellently presented in the Home Study book and group sessions, fulfilled my expectations.
